Thumpety thump thump, thumpety thump thump, look at Frosty go

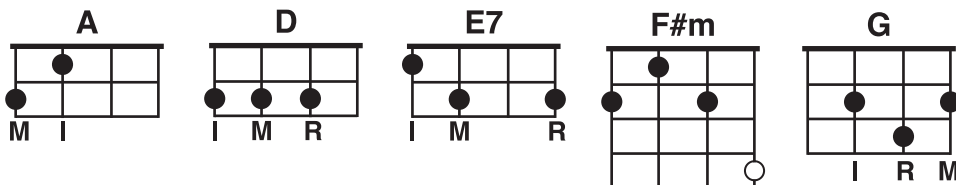
